Virginia Medicaid: Substance Use Disorder Training and Technical Assistance Webinars

These technical assistance and training webinars are designed to increase substance use disorder (SUD) knowledge and to provide support to anyone who serves Medicaid members with SUD. The overall goal of the webinars, as well as other grant activities, is to increase addiction and recovery workforce capacity while also creating a culture of understanding, empathy, and support for individuals with SUD in various workforce settings.
